



Local Bus Services

Semmenge SE1 Saturday service to Diss

It was stated in this magazine last month and also in the bus company's timetable that the above service leaves New Buckenham at 09:16am from opposite The Green. Having spoken to the company, please be advised that, more often than not, the bus driver usually picks passengers up from outside the Inn on the Green. This is due to difficulty in navigating the tight bends in the village.

Flexibus

I realise I may be preaching to the converted, but for those that are not familiar, I would like to draw your attention to the Flexibus.

This service is subsidised by Norfolk County Council and is as it says; a flexible bus service which picks up from your doorstep. From New Buckenham there is a bus on Monday, Wednesday and Friday to Diss, leaving at approximately 09:30am, returning at either 12:30pm or 1.30pm. On Tuesdays and Thursdays the service goes to Attleborough leaving at approximately 10:15am, returning at midday or 2pm. The return fare for both routes is just £4.00 or free for over 65s.

In the school holidays, the returns can be later as the buses are not required for school runs. Please ask when booking. The Flexibus needs to be booked by 3pm the day before travel on 0300 123 1145 or you can book online at:

www.norfolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/public-transport/buses/flexibus

The phone number is also in the *Six Villages Newsletter* every month and in *The Villager*.

There has been a lot in the press lately regarding the possible cessation of village buses and the Flexibus could be one of the services affected if we don't use it.



Summary of Draft Minutes April 2018

1. Apologies from Cllr Chirodian.
2. PC resolved to approve March Minutes.
3. Matters Arising
Clerk confirmed that no reply received from the Cricket Club regarding their annual rent.
4. Financial Matters
 - a) Council noted a bank reconciliation report to March 31st.
 - b) Payments for April were approved.
 - c) Council considered a report on Clerk's Working hours and expenses. It was noted that average hours spent on Council work was 9 hours as opposed to the contractual 7 hours and that the contract allowed for payment for the use of the Clerk's home as an office. Council resolved that the Clerk be paid 9 hours a week from April 1st, subject to quarterly monitoring and a monthly payment of £35 be made for the use of his home as an office.
5. Planning
 - a) Proposed two-storey extension to Oak View, Marsh Lane – no objection.
 - b) Revised plans for The Beams, King Street – objection as it was considered that the garage as designed was capable of being used as a dwelling.
6. Neighbourhood Plan
Cllr Manning reminded Councillors of the Open Day event at the Village Hall on April 24th.

7. Amenities

- a) Cemetery: Cllr Bingham had produced a Plan from the topographical survey which now needed to be populated with burial details.
- b) Allotments: all currently under cultivation.
- c) Closed Churchyard: Council resolved to authorise the purchase of a memorial seat by Mr and Mrs Winser.
- d) Play Area: Cllr Crossman advised some deterioration of some equipment, to be addressed at next safety inspection.

8. Street Lighting Project.

At the request of Mr and Mrs Elvin the Council reconsidered their decision on the style of the lamp attached to their house. The Council decided it was not an appropriate use of public funds to replace the light for purely aesthetic reasons.

Next Meeting, May 8th, is the Annual Parish Council Meeting at which the Chairmen and Vice-Chairman are elected for 2018/19
