News from the Pews

Easter is just around the corner, with the promise of far too much chocolate, but before we get to indulge, there are several services over the Bank Holiday weekend.

Lilies for Easter: whilst in the past we have held a contemplative service to remember loved ones on Good Friday, the format is changing this year and will be on Easter Saturday. There will be no service, but we will be holding a short period of meditation from 12 noon when you can collect your lily, put it in the vase and light a candle. You are welcome to simply come and go, or sit quietly listening to music whilst remembering those you love. We will be there until 1pm, but if you can't come at 12 o'clock, the church will be open until dusk and as usual all the lilies will be named, so you can collect yours. The lilies will then be displayed in the church until they are past their best. Hopefully, you will have received the flyer about the lilies, but if you have any questions, do give me a ring.

Good Friday: on Good Friday we will be holding a reflective service, with choral pieces by the choir, congregational hymns and spoken meditations on the Easter story. It starts at 2pm and everyone is welcome. By tradition, services on Good Friday finish by 3pm.

Easter Sunday: there will be holy communion with Rev Lorraine Summers at 11am – with the promise of a bit more Easter chocolate to enjoy!

coffeemates!: we usually hold these on the second Saturday of the month, which for April would be the 12^{th} – but this month we are moving to Saturday 26^{th} . The reason for doing so is that we are delighted that there is a wedding on the 11^{th} and then the major Benefice Palm Sunday service on the 13^{th} , so it's going to be quite a

busy weekend! The following weekend is Easter and we have the Easter Lilies on the Saturday, to say nothing of not wanting to clash with the first full day of the Art Exhibition and their refreshments. We will be raising funds for the Big C Appeal, a charity close to so many in the community, so we hope to see you there – let's just hope things have warmed up a bit by then!

As a result, the May coffeemates! will be a week later than normal, on the 17th, otherwise it would only be two weeks after the April coffeemates! and you can have too much of a good thing... After that, we'll be back to the second Saturday, through to October.

Fauré Requiem & Choral Favourites Concert: we hope you have your tickets! They are £7 and are available at King's Stores, or you can ring me to book. The Waveney Choir are excellent and it should be a great concert.

New Buckenham Parish Council

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 8th April at the Village Hall, note the earlier time of 7pm.

Following the Parish Council meeting we will be holding the Annual Parish Meeting at 8pm. All Parishioners are welcome to both meetings.

The Annual Parish meeting is an informal forum and provides an opportunity for everyone to raise and discuss any issues affecting the village. Proposals for big changes to local government are progressing rapidly with these affecting us all. Plans for devolution will see the end of Norfolk and Suffolk County Councils which will be merged to form a Unitary Authority with an elected Mayor. It is expected that Breckland Council will disappear, with their role taken on by the Unitary Authority. Ward boundaries will change with much bigger wards and fewer Councillors. How will this impact on local representation? What will be the effect on our Council Tax?

Also, there are major changes to Planning with increased requirement for the local authority to provide more housing to meet government housing delivery targets. How will the village be affected and will we be asked to accept some new houses?

Join us at the Parish Meeting to discuss these and any other issues. We may not (and probably don't) have all the answers, but would very much appreciate hearing your views.

Summary of Draft Minutes: March 2025

Present: Andrew Bingham (AB), Paul Martin (PM), Karen Hobley (KH), Mary Manning (MM), Mary Dowson (MD), Angela Thornton (AT) Clerk, County/District Cllr Steve Askew (SA) and 3 parishioners.

1. Minutes of the February meeting approved.

2. Matters Arising

- a) Norfolk CC has contacted the landowner regarding the problem with footpath FP14.
- b) Highways Officer contacted regarding the drain by Lovells.

3. Public Participation

- a) Posts in front of village gateway need to be removed. Action AB.
- b) Concerns regarding the Inn on the Green planning application including lack of parking, inaccessible bin access/storage.

4. District/County Councillor Report

SA talked through his understanding of the Local Government Reform and Devolution.

The Local Plan has stalled because the government has increased house-building requirements. The call for new sites has been requested. Service Centre Villages will be required to provide an additional 200+ houses. The NB Neighbourhood Plan may help in limiting development, but it is not guaranteed. Breckland DC wishes to engage with parishes to consider possible sites.

The Parish Briefing Report will be attached to the Minutes and available on the website, noticeboard and Facebook.

5. Parish Cllr Reports

- a) MM reported a lack of road markings in the village. SA to contact Highways.
- b) DC reiterated that footpath FP14 was impassable due to overgrown hedgerows and mud.
- c) AB reported that taxis were using the Play Area car park as a 'day car park'.

- d) AB reported that the Anglian Water Mast has been approved by Planning. As Custodial Trustee of the Village Hall, NBPC is required to lodge in writing their support for the mast.
- e) AB attended the LGR and Devolution workshop.

6. Financial Matters

- a) February Bank Reconciliation approved.
- b) Payments for March 2025 approved.

7. Planning

Conversion of dwelling to 3 dwellings: Inn on the Green, Chapel Street. Discussion took place and concerns were raised, including that insufficient time was available to consider the application fully. AT to request an extension.

8. Amenities

- a) Grounds Maintenance: none.
- b) Closed Churchyard: AB met with PCC and agreed some tidying of vegetation on South Wall be discussed with BTS.
- c) Cemetery: none.
- d) Allotments: one vacant plot. Debris accumulating again at the far end of the area. AT to write to tenants.
- e) Play Area: safety inspection report work to be done, order to be sent and funded in 2025/6 budget.
- f) Community Car Scheme going well, 2 more drivers would be of benefit.
- g) Defibrillator: parishioner noted that pads may need replacing this year. KH aware.
