Land for Sale

I am writing to advise readers of two fields that are for sale. As they are particularly close to New Buckenham, I wanted to take this opportunity to let you know.

The first is at Dam Brigg (15.76 acres) located on the corner of the road to Old Buckenham and the road to Banham. The houses on the Banham Road, back on to the land.

The second is the 'Cemetery Field' (17.08 acres) which wraps round the New Buckenham Village Hall and the allotments and includes the meadow opposite Hunts Farm up Cuffer Lane.

In the April 2025 edition of the New Buckenham Parish News, the New Buckenham Parish Council highlighted how the big changes to Local Government are progressing rapidly and outlines how some of the recent Local Government changes might affect a village like New Buckenham. They state: 'There are major changes to Planning with increased requirement for the local authority to provide more housing to meet government housing delivery targets.'

In the February NB Parish Council Minutes, item 4, the report of the District/County Councillor Report states: 'The NB Neighbourhood Plan may help in limiting development, but it is not guaranteed. Breckland DC wishes to engage with parishes to consider possible sites.'

Residents will be aware of the 'Change of use' permission granted on the adjoining field further up Cuffer Lane (3PL/2021/1690/F). Additionally, permission has been granted, with conditions, for the erection of a New Agricultural Building on the same site.

Paula Davy Reminisces

I was born in the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital on 12th August 1971 and lived at Willow Dene, the first bungalow in Marsh Lane. Mum paid £500 for the land and the bungalow was built for mum and dad just before they got married, for £2000. They moved in on 21st March 1970.

Before then my dad, Byron, lived in New Buckenham and my mum, Irene, lived in Winfarthing. My mum's father, Arthur Hall, was on his way into Diss and went round a corner and hit some ice. He went into the bank and smashed his car up so decided to sell the parts. Being a mechanic, my dad went round to buy some of the parts. He saw my mum but didn't have the courage to say much so made the excuse he had to go and get some money and come back another day. Then he got the courage to ask her out. They got married in Winfarthing church.

I went to Old Buckenham Primary School. My mum bribed me on my first day. She bought me a doll's pram and said if I got on the bus and didn't cry I could have it when I got home. It was a big thing getting on this big bus when you're only little but I bit my lip and was happy to see my best friend Dawn Buckle when I got to school. I met Dawn at the playgroup run by Mrs Breeze in the old village hall that used to be called The Tin Shack.

My great grandparents, Caroline and Daniel Davy owned the village shop. It was where the Castle Cafe is now and they also owned all the land at the back and King's Cottage next door. My grandad, Frank, was born there in 1915. Their son, Robert Edgar Davy, known as Edgar, ran the shop after they both died until he retired in 1939. Frank was a vegetarian from quite a young age because of the butcher's next door that put him off eating meat. In those days that was quite unusual. Grandad's eldest brother, Aubrey Egbert Davy, was in the Merchant Navy and was the youngest person in the UK at that time to become captain. That would have been about the time of the First World War.

There was also Stanley whose wife, Sarah Kenny, was quite a well known Tiller Girl dancer at the London Palladium. My dad could remember when he was little and they came round and she danced on the table. My family were quite entertaining.

Grandad Frank had a little shop in some sheds in his garden at the back of Carleton House where I live now. He sold things like clothes, shoes and toys. In the 1940s everyone from the village went round there to buy things from him. He was good at maths and came top in Norfolk in his maths exams. He got a scholarship to Redcap School in Norwich. When we went to the supermarket he could work out how much his shopping was and how much change he was getting before the till could. He was head hunted by a lot of accountants because of his mental maths but decided to set up his shop instead.

My grandad was only 18 when he lost his mum and dad; they died within a few months of each other. His dad had asthma so I don't know if it was an asthma attack. His sister Annie died quite young as well aged 41. My grandad had such a hard time and by losing his parents early he had a nervous breakdown.

He was 21 when he married my nanny, Mary Emma, in 1936. They met on a blind date and even just before he died he could remember what she was wearing on the very first day he set eyes on her - this beautiful blue dress. He knew she was 'the one'. Because his mental health was not great they married secretly at night in New Buckenham church with just the witness and the vicar. My dad, who they named Byron, after Lord Byron, then Alwyn Kneale Daniel was born in 1939. My grandad did a lot of reading so maybe Alwyn and Kneale came from one of the books he'd read.

Nanny played the organ and I think she played it in the chapel at the end of Chapel Street. She had a little organ indoors, was a good singer and sang a lot of hymns. She was quite talented. My grandad liked Danny Boy so nicknamed my dad 'Danny'.

Nanny had an allotment that was behind my house backing onto Rosemary Lane. There's a new house built there now. She grew marrows and made marrow wine every year for Christmas. It was strong. It could blow your head off! I was about 5 when she gave me some and I thought, 'Oh, my goodness......!' She had a big marble slab in the pantry where she made the wine and the pastry. They didn't have fridges and freezers in those days so everything was made from scratch and in season. She was a really good cook and at Christmas

time would make Christmas cake and puddings, mince pies and sausage rolls. I don't think my mum ever lived up to her cooking. I didn't like my mum's cooking which is why I learned to cook at a young age. I don't think dad thought she was a great cook either. She tried but burned a lot of things.

When mum married dad and moved to New Buckenham, it was too far to cycle to work at Emms Clothing Factory on Victoria Road Diss so she gave up work. She had me the following year. Things were harder then as you didn't have disposable nappies or automatic washing machines so every thing took longer. The same with cooking so I think that's what kept her occupied. She helped out with the garden as we grew everything. I loved helping my dad. He got free pig muck from the pig farm next door to put on the garden. It was a bit smelly and there were always a lot of flies. We had a chicken run as well with maybe 50 or more chickens. My mum was more into animals than anything. She had sweet little bantams with fluffy legs so we never bought eggs. Mum sold them in the village. My dad once rescued a battery hen. It was very loving and made friends with a rabbit that was also rescued.

My dad worked long hours as an HGV mechanic; weekends as well. Being a mechanic he would get accident damaged cars and do them up. We had a blue Cortina.

We were lucky enough to go on holiday every year but never went abroad. When I was 10 I got my first dog. My dad bought a caravan then we went on caravan holidays so we could take the dog with us.

I didn't go out of the village much except to school and didn't go to a supermarket until I was 14. There was everything you needed in the village. I had a bike and used to cycle to Banham Zoo with my cousin. There weren't many young people in the village, not like now, so I found it quite hard in the school holidays. I was about 9 when they built the terraced houses down Marsh Lane and made friends with Daniel Boughton who lived there. He was also an only child and so we spent all our time cycling and going for walks. He suddenly moved away as his mum liked to move and I never saw him after that.

When I first left school I got an apprenticeship at The Jolly Farmers, Tacolneston, so got my chef's training there. I've always worked away

from the village and difficult hours. At first, I'd start at 6.00am but since Covid and on-line shopping it's got earlier. I now work at Sainsbury's getting up at 1.00am Monday to Thursday for a 2.30am start but, don't get me wrong, I love my job!

I met Nigel when I was 29. We live in Carleton House on Chapel Street and have two children; Keely who is 21 this year and Kieron who will be 19.

Since I was little I've seen a lot of changes in the village.
