New Buckenham Parish Council

I am sure most of the village are aware of the incident that occurred on Friday 11th July, when much of the village lost their electricity supply. Significant damage happened in Church Street and people were trapped in a vehicle with a live electricity cable over the roof. We understand that this was caused by a lorry collecting the (now redundant) paper recycling bins from the Village Hall. We are grateful to the emergency services for rapidly attending, and to UK Power Networks for making the cables safe and evacuating the people from the vehicle – a very traumatic experience. UK Power Networks worked late into the evening to re-build the cable network and restore power first to the more distant parts of the village and then to Church Street.

This incident did raise concerns over difficulties the Fire Service had in getting to Church Street – car parking on Queen Street blocked access and cars had to be moved before the fire tender could get through. This has brought to the fore other traffic problems in the village and created an opportune time to discuss these.

The Parish Council will be holding an Extraordinary Meeting at 15:30 on Tuesday 12th August at the Village Hall. An officer from Norfolk County Highways will be at the meeting. All parishioners are invited and there will be an opportunity for all to have their say – it may be necessary to limit the time each person is able to speak depending on numbers attending.

Bats in the Belfry

The bat count inside St Martin's church in 2025 is another triumph, although perhaps not so joyous for the cleaners! It was done at approximately the same time as last year, but what a difference in the weather! The drought will have had a serious effect on bats countrywide – reducing a bat's favourite platter, insects. However, we can report that in and around the church we have recorded no fewer than 12 of the UK's 18 species of bat, including some of the rarest. The 52 acres of Common/Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and the compact nature of the village is undoubtedly what makes the area a fabulous home for wildlife of all sorts.

It's important to note that the recordings are a guide, rather than an unequivocal number count. For technical reasons, interior recordings can be complicated. The readings show the identity of each species as a percentage likelihood of accuracy, categorising some as of 'low confidence', meaning that the sound is at a distance from the microphone making it difficult to be certain or that the bat is making a call that is similar to that of another type of bat.

There's no way of ensuring the numbers are absolute. It's always possible that a bat might circle the microphone dozens of times just to confuse us. We haven't found that yet, but who knows?

Our highest count is of the Serotine, which is both vulnerable and rare. It is the most building-orientated species. It's hardly ever found in trees, preferring the high points in churches and old towers.

The person we have to thank for our ability to see in the dark is Dr Stuart Newson. He's visited a number of times and offers advice and help with our citizen science surveys. He is the Senior Research Ecologist with the British Trust for Ornithology and the inventor of this ultrasonic classifier, allowing so much more to be understood about wildlife and conservation. He is constantly upgrading the equipment, which is now available worldwide. His knowledge is scary, which is why he flies around the globe lecturing, overseeing and advising on birds and mammals, not to mention crickets and moths.

The recording equipment was installed for four nights in June. Afterwards, the microphone was placed outside on both the north and south sides of the church for three nights in each case. The microphone goes live at sunset, switching on and off dependent on the echolocations it detects, which is why passing humans don't have to fear being overheard!

The results show 12 species of bat in and around the church, which is incredible. Those not inside the building are often recorded whizzing around outside in the churchyard. Compared with 2024, only one species is missing altogether, whilst another, different one, pitched up.

The one missing is the Lesser Horseshoe bat, but it's known that it prefers the Westcountry and Wales. Our surveys have recorded a rare tourist or two of this variety, but they are quite often categorised as of 'low confidence', meaning it might be something else. It's one of the smallest of bats – the size of a plum and weighing 5g – so, maybe, a move to this side of the country is a flight too far.

On the other hand, a Whiskered Bat turned up this year; or did it? They are very similar to Brandt's bats and were only separated as two different categories in 1970. We know for sure that we have quite a good showing of Brandt's bats, which did not appear around the church at all in 2024.

There are 18 bat species in the UK, 12 of which are recorded in New Buckenham. Some of them are regional, due to the weather conditions, etc. Of the six most endangered species, four are found in New Buckenham. The other two (the Greater Mouse-eared bat and the Grey Long-eared bat) are southerners. Our collection features: Barbastelles (vulnerable), Serotines (vulnerable), Leisler's bat (near threatened), Nathusius pipistrelle (near threatened), Noctule bat, Brandt's bats, Daubenton's bats, Whiskered bats, Natterers bat, soprano pipistrelle, common pipistrelle, Brown Long-eared bat.




